consent of the Senate, from a list of names submitted to the Secretary by the Maryland Psychological Association.

- (4) The Governor shall appoint the consumer member with the advice of the Secretary and the advice and consent of the Senate.
  - (b) Each psychologist member of the Board shall be:
- (1) A licensed psychologist who has practiced, taught, or engaged in research in psychology for at least 5 years;
  - (2) A citizen of the United States; and
  - (3) A resident of this State.
  - (c) The consumer member of the Board:
    - (1) Shall be a member of the general public;
- (2) May not be or ever have been a psychologist or in training to become a psychologist;
- (3) May not have a household member who is a psychologist or in training to become a psychologist;
- (4) May not participate or ever have participated in a commercial or professional field related to psychology;
- (5) May not have a household member who participates in a commercial or professional field related to psychology; and
- (6) May not have had within 2 years before appointment a substantial financial interest in a person regulated by the Board.
- (d) While a member of the Board, a consumer member may not have a substantial financial interest in a person regulated by the Board.
  - (e) Before taking office, each appointee to the Board shall take the oath required by Article I, § 9 of the State Constitution.
    - (f) (l) The term of a member is 3 years.
  - (2) The terms of members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Board on July 1, 1981.
  - (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
