- (B) BEFORE THE DEPARTMENT ISSUES, RENEWS, OR EXTENDS A PERMIT FOR A REFUSE DISPOSAL SYSTEM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY EACH MEMBER OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY:
- (1) WHOSE LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT INCLUDES THE SITE OR PROPOSED SITE OF THE REFUSE DISPOSAL SYSTEM; AND OR
 - (2) WHO HAS REQUESTED NOTIFICATION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1988.
