VETOES

This bill reduces the Federal funding requirement with respect to light rail transit projects to 10% and defines light rail transit as that which is electrically powered and can operate in mixed traffic with automobiles.

House Bill 505, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 2, 1988, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 314.
