In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 458.

This bill extends the cost requirements for health maintenance organizations to 1991, but exempts ambulatory surgical centers controlled by health maintenance organizations.

House Bill 532, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1988, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 458.
