## WILLIAM DONALD SCHAEFER, Governor

This bill establishes the Physical Therapist Rehabilitation Committee, grants the members immunity from civil liability, and provides that proceedings of the Committee are not discoverable and not admissible into evidence in civil actions.

House Bill 1078, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 27, 1988, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 578.
