- (B) AN APPLICANT FOR CERTIFICATION SHALL SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT ON THE FORM THAT THE DEPARTMENT REQUIRES.
- (C) (1) AN APPLICANT FOR A LICENSE SHALL PAY TO THE DEPARTMENT THE APPLICATION FEE SET BY THE DEPARTMENT.

- (E) BEFORE THE DEPARTMENT DISAPPROVES AN APPLICATION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL GIVE THE APPLICANT AN OPPORTUNITY FOR A PUBLIC HEARING.
- (F) THE SECRETARY MAY DELEGATE TO THE COMMISSIONER THE AUTHORITY TO ISSUE OR RENEW A CERTIFICATE TO ANY HEALTH INSURER OR NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLAN REGULATED UNDER ARTICLE 48A OF THE CODE OR HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION ISSUED A CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBTITLE 7 OF THIS TITLE THAT MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE AND ALL APPLICABLE REGULATIONS OF THE SECRETARY.

- (A) WHEN AN APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION IS FILED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, THE APPLICANT SHALL SUBMIT A UTILIZATION REVIEW PLAN.
  - (B) THE UTILIZATION REVIEW PLAN SHALL INCLUDE:
- (1) SPECIFIC A DESCRIPTION OF REVIEW STANDARDS AND PROCEDURES TO BE USED IN EVALUATING PROPOSED OR DELIVERED HOSPITAL CARE;
- (2) THOSE CIRCUMSTANCES, IF ANY, UNDER WHICH UTILIZATION REVIEW MAY BE DELEGATED TO A HOSPITAL UTILIZATION REVIEW PROGRAM; AND
