(j) All insurers or self-insurers shall submit to the Commission the rehabilitation progress report form as prescribed by the Commission pertaining to any employee who has received temporary total disability benefits for a continuous period of 6 months. Thereafter, insurers and self-insurers shall provide the Commission with further rehabilitation progress reports at 120-day intervals or sooner as requested by the Commission. If the Commission finds that any insurer or self-insurer has failed to file such records within the time prescribed by this subsection, the Commission may assess against the party a fine not to exceed \$500.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1988.
