House Bill No. 619

AN ACT concerning

Optometry - Use of Topical Ocular Diagnostic Pharmaceutical Agents

FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice optometry" to include the use of drugs or medicine under certain conditions; allowing certain optometrists to use diagnostic pharmaceutical agents under topical ocular certain circumstances; providing certain qualifications certification under this Act; establishing certain minimum standards for certain education courses that meet the requirements of this Act; creating certain restrictions the use of topical ocular diagnostic pharmaceutical agents by certain optometrists; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to collect and report certain statistical information; establishing certain duties for the Board of Examiners in Optometry and the Department of Health and Hygiene; and generally relating to the use of drugs or medicine by licensed optometrists.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Health Occupations Section 10-101(f) Annotated Code of Maryland (1986 Replacement Volume and 1987 Supplement)

BY adding to
