AN ACT concerning

Juror Selection - Qualification and Summoning

FOR the purpose of providing that a court may use a certain procedure to qualify and summons prospective jurors; requiring a certain notice to be sent to prospective jurors under certain circumstances; and generally relating to juror selection procedures.

BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings Section 8-206 and 8-208 Annotated Code of Maryland (1984 Replacement Volume and 1987 Supplement)

BY adding to

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings Section 8-208.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (1984 Replacement Volume and 1987 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

8-206.

(a) The clerk or jury commissioner, or the Administrative Office of the Courts, as appropriate, shall mail to every person whose name is drawn from the master wheel under § 8-205 or from the source list under § 8-202(b)(l), a juror qualification form, with instructions to fill out, sign, certify, and return it by mail, within ten days.
