(v) Any family wine producer 21 years of age of older shall be permitted to bring into the State of Maryland, transport or possess within the State of Maryland, family-produced wine for personal use or for entry in a licensed national family wine exhibition.

(a) An individual applicant, an applicant qualifying as A resident applicant for a corporation or each applicant for a partnership[,] applying for A manufacturer's or wholesaler's license shall have been for two years next preceding the filing of the application a resident of the State of Maryland.

(i) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a) of this section, the board of license commissioners for Prince George's County may not issue any Class B beer license with other than the privilege of selling beer for consumption on the licensed [premise] PREMISES (on-sale only). However, licensees holding this class of license prior to July 1, 1975, who have been exercising the privilege of selling beer for consumption off the licensed [premise] PREMISES may continue to exercise this privilege. The annual fee for this license is \$200.
