The area of operation of a housing authority of a county shall include all of the county except that portion thereof which lies within the territorial boundaries of any city for which a housing authority may be created under this article, unless the governing body of any such city shall by proper resolution consent to its inclusion in the area of operation of such county authority. With respect to the provisions of other sections of this article and their application to housing authorities of counties, the term "city" shall be construed as referring to a county unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context.
