SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Government

3-406.

- (a) The publisher of the Code of Public General Laws [shall] MAY:
- (1) codify each executive order that is issued in statutory form under Article II, § 24 of the Maryland Constitution, as statutes are codified; and
- (2) as to other executive orders that are required to be published:
- (i) to the extent possible, arrange each of these executive orders by the article of the Code to which the executive order relates; and
- (ii) publish these executive orders in a volume or other separate part of the Code, as the Maryland Rules are published.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

## 492. (Chapter 589 version)

This section only applies to Wicomico [and Allegany Counties] COUNTY. No person whatsoever shall work or do any bodily labor on the Lord's day, commonly called Sunday; and no person having children or servants shall command, or wittingly or willingly suffer any of them to do any manner of work or labor on the Lord's day (works of necessity and charity always excepted), nor shall suffer or permit any children or servants to profane the Lord's day by gaming, fowling, hunting, or unlawful pastime or recreation. Every person transgressing this section and being hereof convicted shall forfeit five dollars, which, if the fine is imposed by a circuit court of any county, shall be applied to the use of the county or city as the case may be. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, the provisions of this section shall not apply:
