(D) (1) THE DIRECTOR SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE SECRETARY AND TO THE GOVERNOR.

(2) THE ANNUAL REPORT SHALL CONTAIN:

(I) THE INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN ARTICLE 27, § 678 OF THE CODE;

(II) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE AND NONELIGIBLE PERSONS EVALUATED AT THE INSTITUTION;

(III) THE DECISIONS OF THE BOARD OF REVIEW TO GRANT LEAVE TO ELIGIBLE PERSONS;

(IV) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF REARRESTS, RECONVICTIONS, REINCARCERATIONS, AND PAROLE VIOLATIONS OF PERSONS FORMERLY INCARCERATED AT THE PATUXENT INSTITUTION;

(V) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE PERSONS INCARCERATED AT THE PATUXENT INSTITUTION WHO ARE RETURNED TO THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION FOR MAJOR VIOLATIONS OF THE INSTITUTION'S DISCIPLINARY RULES;

(VI) INFORMATION ON THE TYPE OF MAJOR VIOLATION NECESSITATING THE PERSON'S TRANSFER TO THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (V) OF THIS PARAGRAPH; AND

(VII) INFORMATION ON EDUCATION PROGRAMS AND COMMUNITY REENTRY ACTIVITIES.

(3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT AND PUBLISH REGULATIONS REGARDING THE ANNUAL REPORT REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

4A.

(A) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE.

(B) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF § 10-101(E)(2)(I) OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION, OTHER THAN REGULATIONS PERTAINING ONLY TO ROUTINE INTERNAL MANAGEMENT OF THE INSTITUTION, SHALL COMPLY WITH THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT.

(C) REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SECTION BY THE SECRETARY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT SHALL INCLUDE REGULATIONS GOVERNING:
