

(1) A regularly enrolled student; and

(2) In good standing in a public high school in the State.

(d) (1) Each member serves for a term of [5] 4 years and until a successor is appointed and qualifies. These terms are staggered as required by the terms of the members serving on the State Board as of July 1, [1978] 1989.

[(2) The seven members serving on the State Board as of June 30, 1976 are:

(i) Members of the Board for the remainder of their terms; and

(ii) Eligible for reappointment to the same extent as on June 30, 1976.]

[(3)] (2) The Governor shall appoint a new member to fill any vacancy on the Board for the remainder of that term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

[(4)] (3) A member is eligible for reappointment but may not serve for more than two full [5-year] 4-YEAR terms.

[(5)] (4) The student member shall serve for a term of 1 year. A student member is eligible for reappointment but may not serve more than 2 full 1-year terms.

(i) All operations of the Department; [and]
