

(d) The Advisory Council shall meet at least 6 times a year at the times and places that it determines.

(e) A member of the Advisory Council:

(1) May not receive compensation; but

(2) Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the [State] Standard STATE Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

(f) The Advisory Council shall:

(1) Advise the Department on the implementation of an early identification program and follow-up of hearing-impaired infants and infants who have a risk factor of developing a hearing impairment;

(2) Provide consultation to the Department in the development of the program;

(3) Make recommendations for operation of the program;

(4) Advise the Department:

(i) In setting standards for the program;

(ii) In monitoring and reviewing the program;

(iii) In providing quality assurance for the program;

(5) Provide consultation to the Department in the establishment of an educational program for families, professionals, and the public that can be integrated with existing State and local education agency programs; and

(6) Review any materials the Department may distribute to the public concerning hearing-impaired infants.

(g) [The Advisory Council shall terminate on July 1, 1989.]

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(a) The Secretary may contract with any qualified person to administer the program.
