- -f-(a) In Worcester County it is unlawful for any licensee under this article to employ any person under the age of 2½ 18 years in the sale of alcoholic beverages, unless a permit is obtained from the Sheriff and State's Attorney of Worcester County. [However it is lawful to employ persons between 18 and 21 years of age for the purpose of the sale of beer and light wine without obtaining a permit.]
- -f-(b)-j-(A) It is unlawful for any licensee under this article to allow any person not designated under § 2(t) of this article to loaf or loiter about the place of business for which the license is issued; restaurants may, however, serve meals without alcoholic beverages to any person.
