- "ASSAULT WEAPON" DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY FIREARM MODIFIED TO RENDER IT PERMANENTLY INOPERATIVE.
- (B) (1) A DEALER OR PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR TRANSFER ASSAULT WEAPON TO A PERSON WHOM THE DEALER OR PERSON KNOWS OR HAS REASONABLE CAUSE TO BELIEVE:
- HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A CRIME OF VIOLENCE (I) OR OF ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE;
  - (II) IS A FUGITIVE FROM JUSTICE;
- (III) IS AN HABITUAL DRUNKARD OR IS ADDICTED TO OR AN HABITUAL USER OF NARCOTICS, BARBITURATES, OR AMPHETAMINES;
  - (IV) IS OF UNSOUND MIND;
- (V) IS VISIBLY UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS; OR
  - (VI) IS UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE.
- A DEALER MAY NOT SELL OR TRANSFER ANY ASSAULT WEAPON UNTIL THE DEALER COMPLIES WITH ALL OF THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SALE OR TRANSFER OF A PISTOL OR REVOLVER AS PROVIDED UNDER § 442 OF THIS ARTICLE.
- (C) A PERSON WHO KNOWINGLY VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION OR WHO KNOWINGLY GIVES FALSE INFORMATION IN ORDER TO OBTAIN AN ASSAULT WEAPON SHALL, ON CONVICTION, BE FINED NOT MORE THAN \$10,000 OR IMPRISONED FOR NOT MORE THAN 3 YEARS OR BOTH.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect &uly-1,-1989 January 1, 1990.
