[Any] A person who violates or causes an act which violates [the provisions] A PROVISION of this subtitle or A REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE OR WHO violates or fails to comply with [any] A PERMIT OR AN order of the Department when due notice is given is guilty of a misdemeanor. Upon conviction [he] THE VIOLATOR is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$1,000] \$500 PER DAY FOR EACH DAY OF THE OFFENSE, AND NOT TO EXCEED A TOTAL FINE OF \$25,000, with costs imposed in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.
