- At a public or private sale; and
- 2. After the property has been advertised for at least 20 days.
- (v) In Frederick County, in addition to the authority granted in this section, the Board of County Commissioners may sell at a public or private sale any real property owned by the Board of County Commissioners, if the Board of County Commissioners:
- 1. Determines that the property is no longer needed for any public use; and
- 2. Subject to the procedures of the County Commissioners, provides adequate notice and a hearing on the sale of the real property.
- (4) IN CHARLES COUNTY, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR USE IN THE PRODUCTION OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR FAMILIES OF LIMITED INCOME AS DEFINED IN ARTICLE 83B, § 2-302 OF THE CODE:
- (I) MAY, BY RESOLUTION, TRANSFER WITH WITHOUT CONSIDERATION REAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE COUNTY NO NEEDED FOR A PUBLIC PURPOSE TO ANY PRIVATE NONPROFIT CORPORATION IN THE COUNTY PROVIDED THAT:
- THERE IS A PUBLIC HEARING AT WHICH THE 1. COMMISSIONERS SOLICIT AND RECEIVE COMMENTS CONCERNING THE TRANSFER AND CONSIDERATION IS GIVEN TO BUT NOT LIMITED TO:
- UNIQUE CHARACTERISTICS OF ANY STRUCTURE ON THE PROPERTY:
 - B. HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE, IF ANY:
- C. COMPATIBILITY OF THE PROPOSED USE WITH THE NEIGHBORHOOD; AND
- FINANCIAL ASPECTS, INCLUDING D. ABILITY OF THE PROPOSED USER TO CONSTRUCT, RENOVATE, MAINTAIN, AND OPERATE A FACILITY ON THE PROPERTY;
- 2. NOTICE OF THE HEARING IS ADVERTISED IN AT LEAST 1 NEWSPAPER HAVING GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE COUNTY EACH WEEK FOR 2 CONSECUTIVE WEEKS, THE LAST OF WHICH ONCE ADVERTISEMENT MAY NOT APPEAR LATER THAN 1 WEEK PRIOR HEARING; AND
- 3. AN APPRAISAL IS MADE BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE PROPERTY TO BE INCLUDED IN THE NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING:
