- (a) (1) If the former holder of a physical therapy license or physical therapist assistant license fails for any reason to renew the license within 3 years after it has expired, the Board shall reinstate the appropriate license, if the physical therapist or physical therapist assistant:
- (i) Was licensed by passing [the examination of -f-the Professional Examination Service] A BOARD APPROVED NATIONAL LICENSING EXAMINATION;
- (ii) Has not practiced actively physical therapy or limited physical therapy in this State during that period;
 - (iii) Otherwise is entitled to be licensed;
- (iv) Pays to the Board the application fee $% \left(\frac{1}{2}\right) =0$ set by the Board; and
- $\mbox{\ensuremath{(v)}}$ Submits to the Board an application on the form required by the Board.
- (2) The Board may not require the physical therapist or physical therapist assistant who qualifies for reinstatement under this subsection to be reexamined under § 13-306 of this subtitle.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.
