## CHAPTER 412

(House Bill 345)

AN ACT concerning

Queen Anne's County - Public Facilities School Bonds

FOR purpose of authorizing and empowering Commissioners of Queen Anne's County from time to time, to borrow not more than \$3,250,000 \$4,000,000 in order to finance the cost of certain school facilities in Queen Anne's County and to effect that borrowing by the issuance and sale at public or private sale of its general obligation bonds in like par amount; empowering the County to fix and determine, by resolution, the form, tenor, interest rate rates or method of determining the same, terms, conditions, maturities, and all other details incident to the issuance and sale of the bonds; empowering the County to issue refunding bonds for the purchase or redemption of bonds in advance of maturity; empowering and directing the County to levy, impose, and collect, annually, ad valorem taxes rate and amount sufficient to provide funds for the payment of the maturing principal of and interest on the bonds; exempting the bonds and refunding bonds, and the interest thereon and any income derived therefrom, from all county, municipal and other taxation in the State of Maryland; and relating generally to the issuance and sale of such bonds by Queen Anne's County.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That, as used in this Act, the term "County" means the body politic and corporate of the State of Maryland known as County Commissioners of Queen Anne's County, and the term "school facilities" means the costs of acquisition, alteration, construction, reconstruction, enlargement, expansion, extension, improvement, rehabilitation, renovation, and repair of county schools, including all associated access, utilities and other infrastructure, purchase and development of property, acquisition and installation of equipment and furnishings, together with any
