- (ii) became licensed in a local jurisdiction
 after:
- passing, in that local jurisdiction, an examination that is equivalent to the examination for which the applicant is seeking the waiver; and
- 2. meeting, in that local jurisdiction, requirements that are equivalent to the licensing requirements of this subtitle: and
- (3) submits a statement from the local jurisdiction certifying:
- (i) the applicant is in good standing with the local jurisdiction;
- (ii) the applicant obtained the local license by taking an examination equivalent to the examination given by the State Board; and
 - (iii) the date of the local examination.
- (c) An initial State license that is obtained under this section may not be reinstated UNLESS MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF 6-312.

- (a) Subject to the limitations in this section, a local jurisdiction shall waive its examination requirements for an individual who is licensed by the State Board to provide electrical services as a master electrician.
- (b) A local jurisdiction [may] SHALL grant a waiver under this section only if the applicant:
- (1) pays any license fee that the local jurisdiction requires; and
 - (2) provides adequate evidence that the applicant:
- (i) became licensed as a master electrician under this title after passing an examination given by the State Board OR COMPLIES WITH \S 6-307;
