- (1) 3 shall be chosen on the basis of their interest in and experience with minors and juvenile problems;
 - (2) 3 shall:
- (i) Be, at the time of appointment to a first term, 16 years old or older and under the age of 25 years; and
- (ii) Include at least 1 individual who has been under the jurisdiction of the [Agency] DEPARTMENT.
 - (c) (1) The term of a member is 3 years.
- (2) The terms of members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the State Advisory Board of Juvenile Services on July 1, 1982. The terms of one-third of those members end each year.
- (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (5) A member who serves 2 consecutive full 3-year terms may not be reappointed for 3 years after completion of those terms.

2-109.

- (a) The State Advisory Board shall meet regularly at least 10 times a year, on the call of its chairman.
 - (b) A member of the State Advisory Board:
 - (1) May not receive compensation; but
- (2) Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- (c) A member of the State Advisory Board may not have a direct or indirect interest in any contract for building, repairing, equipping, or providing materials or supplies to the [Agency] DEPARTMENT or have any other financial interest in a contract with the [Agency] DEPARTMENT.
