CHAPTER 564

(Senate Bill 278)

AN ACT concerning

Insurance - Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Corporation

FOR the purpose of altering the name of the Maryland Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association to be the Life Health Insurance Guaranty Corporation; clarifying relationship of the State of Maryland to the Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Corporation; altering the powers of Corporation; clarifying that the powers, duties, obligations of the Corporation are more accurately reflected as those of a private, nonprofit, nonstock corporation independent of the State; providing that the obligations and liabilities of the Corporation are not those of the State; providing that Corporation moneys are not considered part of the General Fund of the State; prohibiting the State from budgeting or appropriating funds for the Corporation; clarifying the Corporation's immunity from liability when performing the duties and powers under this subtitle; providing for the retroactive application of this Act; providing that existing obligations or contract rights be impaired by this Act; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to the Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Corporation.
