Article - Business Occupations

4-101.

- (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- "APPRENTICE BARBER" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO, UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A MASTER BARBER, IS LEARNING TO PRACTICE BARBERING IN A BARBERSHOP THAT HOLDS A BARBERSHOP PERMIT.
- [(b)] (C) "Barber" means an individual who practices barbering.
- [(c)](D)(l) "Barbershop" means any commercial establishment, except a beauty salon, in which an individual practices barbering.
- (2) "Barbershop" does not include a clinic in a barber school that holds a school permit.
- [(d)] (E) "Barbershop permit" means a permit issued by the Board to operate a barbershop.
 - [(e)] (F) "Board" means the State Board of Barbers.
- [(f)] (G) "Journey barber" means a barber who is licensed by the Board to practice barbering under the supervision of a master barber.
- [(q)] (H) (l) "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license issued by the Board to teach or practice barbering.
- (2) "License" includes, unless the context requires otherwise, each of the following licenses:
