PROPERTY SHALL HAVE POSTED THE PROPERTY AGAINST UNLAWFUL ENTRY OR TRESPASS BY PLACING:

- (1) SIGNS WHERE THEY MAY REASONABLY BE SEEN; OR
- (2) IDENTIFYING PAINT MARKS ON TREES OR POSTS AT EACH ROAD ENTRANCE AND ADJACENT TO PUBLIC ROADWAYS AND, PUBLIC WATERWAYS, AND ANY OTHER LANDS ADJOINING THE PROPERTY.
- (B) A PAINT MARK UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(2) OF THIS SECTION SHALL:
- (1) BE A VERTICAL LINE AT LEAST TWO INCHES IN WIDTH AND AT LEAST EIGHT INCHES IN LENGTH;
- (2) BE CENTERED AT LEAST THREE FEET BUT NO MORE THAN SIX FEET FROM THE GROUND OR FROM THE WATER SURFACE AT ITS MEAN HIGH TIDE FOR TIDAL WATER OR ITS NORMAL LEVEL FOR NONTIDAL WATER; AND
- (3) BE READILY VISIBLE TO ANY PERSON WITH NORMAL EYESIGHT WHO APPROACHES THE PROPERTY.
- (C) THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT PRESCRIBE THE TYPE AND COLOR OF PAINT TO BE USED FOR POSTING PROPERTY UNDER THIS SECTION.

- (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT PRESCRIBE THE TYPE AND COLOR OF PAINT TO BE USED FOR POSTING PRIVATE PROPERTY UNDER ARTICLE 27, § 576A OF THE CODE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.
