THE BOARD SHALL GIVE EXAMINATIONS TO APPLICANTS AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR, AT THE TIMES AND PLACES THAT THE BOARD DETERMINES.

(C) NOTICE OF EXAMINATION.

THE BOARD SHALL GIVE EACH QUALIFIED APPLICANT NOTICE OF THE TIME AND PLACE OF EXAMINATION.

- (D) SUBJECTS AND METHOD OF EXAMINATION.
- (1) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE SUBJECTS, SCOPE, AND FORM OF AND THE PASSING SCORE FOR EXAMINATIONS GIVEN UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.
- (2) THE EXAMINATION SHALL CONSIST OF A WRITTEN PART AND A PRACTICAL PART.
- (3) THE WRITTEN PART OF THE EXAMINATION SHALL COVER THE SUBJECTS OF:
 - (I) THE BASIC PHYSICS OF SOUND;
 - (II) THE HUMAN HEARING MECHANISM, INCLUDING:
 - THE SCIENCE OF HEARING;
 - 2. THE CAUSES OF HEARING DISORDERS; AND
- 3. THE REHABILITATION OF A HEARING IMPAIRED INDIVIDUAL;
- (III) THE BASIC PSYCHOLOGY THAT RELATES TO A HEARING IMPAIRED INDIVIDUAL;
- (IV) THE STRUCTURE AND FUNCTIONS OF HEARING AIDS;
 - (V) THE THEORY OF MASKING METHODOLOGY;
 - (VI) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE; AND
- (VII) THE AVAILABILITY OF SOCIAL SERVICES AND OTHER SPECIAL RESOURCES FOR A HEARING IMPAIRED INDIVIDUAL.
- (4) THE PRACTICAL PART OF THE EXAMINATION SHALL TEST PROFICIENCY IN:
- (I) PURE TONE AUDIOMETRY, INCLUDING TESTING AND RECORDING OF AIR AND BONE CONDUCTION;
 - (II) RECORDED SPEECH AUDIOMETRY, INCLUDING:
