- (1) THE APPLICANT CERTIFIES THAT THE APPLICANT IS UNABLE TO OBTAIN ON REASONABLE TERMS SUFFICIENT CREDIT TO FINANCE ITS ACTUAL NEEDS WITHOUT THE GUARANTEE; AND
- (2) THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS DETERMINES THAT THERE IS A REASONABLE ASSURANCE OF REPAYMENT OF THE LOAN OBLIGATION.
- (D) THE ELIGIBLE COST OF A PROJECT FOR STATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER $\S-9-275\{B\}$ \S 9-275(2) OF THIS SUBTITLE MAY INCLUDE ONLY THE COSTS OF PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, EQUIPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, AND REHABILITATION OR IMPROVEMENT AS APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- (E) STATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE UNDER $\S-9-275(B)$ $\S-9-275(2)$ OF THIS SUBTITLE MAY NOT EXCEED 50 PERCENT OF THE ELIGIBLE COSTS. 9-1702.
- (G) IN STUDYING FEASIBLE METHODS FOR THE MANAGEMENT AND RECYCLING OF USED TIRES UNDER SUBSECTION (E)(9) OF THIS SECTION, THE OFFICE OF RECYCLING SHALL CONSULT WITH THE APPROPRIATE INDUSTRY, INCLUDING REPRESENTATIVES OF:
 - (1) TIRE MANUFACTURERS;
 - (2) TIRE DEALERS; AND
 - (3) TIRE RECYCLERS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take-effect-July-1,-1989 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
