- (b) (1) Commissioners shall be adult residents of the counties in which they serve, but they need not be lawyers.
- (2) [Each commissioner shall receive as compensation an amount equal to that received by a classified employee in the State merit system as follows:
 - (i) Starting salary......Grade 13, base
- (ii) Maximum salary for up through 5 years
- (iii) Salary at beginning of 6th year of
 - (iv) Shift supervisors......Grade 15, Step 6
- (v) Supervisors......Grade 16, Step 6] THE SALARY OF COMMISSIONERS SHALL BE SET BY THE SECRETARY OF PERSONNEL.
- (3) Each commissioner shall hold office at pleasure of the Chief Judge of the District Court, and has the powers and duties prescribed by law.
- (4) Except without additional compensation, unless otherwise fixed by law, a classified employee of the District Court, who is an adult, may be granted, in the same manner, commissioner powers and duties in the county where he is employed.
- SECTION--2---AND-BE-IT-FURTHER-ENACTED,-That-this-Act-shall take-effect-July-1,-1989.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on July 1, 1990, each commissioner shall receive as compensation not less than an amount equal to that received by a classified employee in the State Merit System as follows:
 - (i) Starting salary......Grade 12, Base
- (ii) Maximum salary for up through 5 years of service......Grade 12, Step 6
- (iii) Salary at beginning of 6th year of service and thereafter.....Grade 13, Step 6

 - (v) Supervisors......Grade 15, Step 6.
