- (2) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERS WITH CONSIDERATION TO GEOGRAPHIC REPRESENTATION, THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY, AND ADVOCACY GROUPS.
- (3) TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT POSSIBLE, MEMBERS SHALL BE KNOWLEDGEABLE IN, CONCERNED WITH, OR COMMITTED TO THE FIELD OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT.
 - (4) (I) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 3 YEARS.
- (II) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ON JULY 1, 1989.
- (III) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- (IV) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- (5) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER FOR IMCOMPETENCE OR MISCONDUCT, OR FOR FAILURE TO ATTEND MEETINGS UNDER ARTICLE 41, \S 1-203 OF THE CODE.
- (D) (1) FROM-AMONG-ITS-MEMBERS,-THE-BOARD-ANNUALLY-SHABE EBECT-A-CHAIRMAN-AND-A-VICE-CHAIRMAN THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL DESIGNATE A CHAIRMAN AND A VICE CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG THE BOARD MEMBERS.
 - (2) 5 MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ARE A OUORUM.
- (3) THE BOARD SHALL MEET AT LEAST 3 TIMES A YEAR, AT THE TIMES AND PLACES THAT IT DETERMINES.
 - (E) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD:
 - (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION; BUT
 - (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
 - (F) THE OFFICE SHALL PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT FOR THE BOARD.
 - (G) THE BOARD HAS THE FOLLOWING POWERS AND DUTIES:
 - (1) TO REVIEW ALL APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS AND RECOMMEND APPROPRIATE ACTION ON SUCH REQUESTS BEFORE FORWARDING THEM TO THE OFFICE DIRECTOR FOR FINAL ACTION;
 - (2) TO FACILITATE INFORMATION EXCHANGE BETWEEN GROUPS CONCERNED WITH PREVENTION PROGRAMS OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT;
