LAWS OF MARYLAND

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 2, and 5 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989, and shall remain effective for a period of 1 year. At the end of June 30, 1990, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, Sections 2, and 5 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
