

SECTION ~~-5-~~ 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That by January 1, 1990, the Secretary of General Services shall conduct a study of the feasibility of locating all or most administrative law judges at a single location. ~~Until this study is implemented, an administrative law judge may continue to work at the location at which the employee worked prior to transfer to the Office of Administrative Hearings.~~

SECTION ~~-6-~~ 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections ~~-4-~~ 5 and ~~-5-~~ 6 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.

SECTION ~~-7-~~ 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 1, 2, 3, and ~~-3-~~ 4 of this Act shall take effect January 1, 1990.

(Senate Bill 719)

AN ACT concerning

Human Immunodeficiency Virus - Omnibus Bill

FOR the purpose of defining certain terms; ~~altering the definition of a certain term~~ definitions of certain terms; establishing procedures for health care providers for obtaining blood samples for the purposes of testing blood for the presence of the human immunodeficiency virus; authorizing certain health care providers to inform ~~local health officers~~ certain persons of the identity of certain individuals under certain conditions; requiring the local health officer to enforce the requirements governing the control of infectious and contagious diseases when notified that an individual has tested HIV positive; establishing procedures for certain individuals to request notification that a certain exposure has occurred; providing for certain penalties; providing certain immunity to certain health care providers under certain circumstances; ~~altering a certain definition~~; requiring certain persons to furnish blood samples for the purposes of testing blood for the presence of the human immunodeficiency virus under certain circumstances; requiring the notification of certain employees of the results of a certain test; requiring the provision of certain counseling to inmates and correctional employees under certain circumstances; requiring correctional institutions to develop certain written procedures; requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental
