AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That by January 1, 1990, the Secretary of General Services shall conduct a study of the feasibility of locating all or most administrative law judges at a single location. Until-this-study-is-implemented,-an administrative-law-judge-may-continue-to-work-at-the-location-at which-the-employee-worked-prior-to-transfer--to-the-Office--of Administrative-Hearings.

SECTION -6- $\frac{7}{2}$. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections -4- $\frac{5}{2}$ and -5- $\frac{6}{2}$ of this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.

SECTION -7- $\underline{8}$. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 1, 2, $\underline{3}$, and -3- $\underline{4}$ of this Act shall take effect January 1, 1990. Approved May 25, 1989.
