- (K) (L) (1) THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OR---ASSOCIATION, LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY, AND ALL OTHER AGENCIES OR ORGANIZATIONS EMPLOYING A FIRE FIGHTER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN, RESCUE SQUADMAN, LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, OR CORRECTIONAL OFFICER SHALL DEVELOP WRITTEN PROCEDURES FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SECTION.
- (2) ON REQUEST, COPIES OF THE PROCEDURES DEVELOPED IN THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO EMPLOYEES, EMPLOYEE UNIONS, VOLUNTEER ASSOCIATIONS, AND THE SECRETARY.
- (M) A PERSON UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT REFUSE TO TREAT OR TRANSPORT AN INDIVIDUAL BECAUSE THE INDIVIDUAL IS HIV POSITIVE.

- (a) An individual who has an infectious disease that endangers public health may not willfully:
- (1) Be in a public place without taking proper precautions against exposing other individuals to the disease; for;
- (2) Transfer to another individual any article that has been exposed to the disease without thoroughly disinfecting the article; $-\Theta R$
- (3)--KNOWINGLY-AND-INTENTIONALLY-TRANSFER--OR-ATTEMPT TO-TRANSFER-THE-INFECTIOUS-DISEASE-TO-ANOTHER-INDIVIDUAL.
- (b) A person who violates any provision of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding $\{\$500\}$ $\$2_{7}500$ or imprisonment not exceeding $\{\$2_{7}500\}$ year $\{\$2_{7}500\}$ or imprisonment not exceeding $\{\$2_{7}500\}$

- (A) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS THE HUMAN IMMUNODEFICIENCY VIRUS MAY NOT KNOWINGLY TRANSFER OR ATTEMPT TO TRANSFER THE HUMAN IMMUNODEFICIENCY VIRUS TO ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL.
- (B) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$2,500 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 3 YEARS OR BOTH.
