

District Court of Maryland for the corporation "notwithstanding any Maryland District Rule to the contrary", is deleted as unnecessary in light of Md. Constitution, Art. IV, § 18(a).

As to the requirements for registration before the Patent and Trademark Office, see Title 37, Part 10, Code of Federal Regulations.

See also Rule 18 of the Rules Governing Admission to the Bar, which allows a law student to practice law under the supervision of a supervising attorney. The Business Occupations Article Review Committee notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, that, until January 1, 1988, the dollar limitation in former Art. 27, § 14A -- now subsection (b)(3)(i) of this section -- conformed to the amount that delineated small claims in the District Court of Maryland, under CJ § 4-405. However, Ch. 314, Acts of 1987, raised the amount for small claims to \$2,500. The General Assembly may wish to consider whether a reference to the amount set under CJ § 4-405 should be substituted for the \$1,000 currently set forth in subsection (b)(3)(i) of this section to reflect Ch. 314 and to accommodate possible changes to CJ § 4-405 without the necessity of a corresponding change here.
