RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy be encouraged to develop a statewide drug information center accessible to both patients and health care providers to meet the information needs of these groups regarding the appropriate use of drugs concerning medication; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy be encouraged to establish a statewide consumer hotline to provide answers to patients' questions about drug therapy; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the General Assembly support the efforts of the University of Maryland School of Pharmacy; and be it further
