SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect upon or application to any cause of action arising prior to the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1989.

Death Penalty - Mentally Retarded

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person found guilty of murder in the first degree from being sentenced to death if the person is-found-to-have-been establishes by a preponderance of the evidence that the person was mentally retarded at the time
