Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 398.

This bill alters the administrative sanctions for drunk driving and the provisions relating to the refusal to take an alcohol test. It also includes numerous procedural requirements for the Motor Vehicle Administration and the new administrative license suspension provision.

House Bill 556, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 19, 1989, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 398.

Drunk and Drugged Driving

FOR the purpose of altering the administrative sanctions for driving or attempting to drive under certain conditions involving alcohol, drugs, or controlled dangerous
