This bill requires a person who engages in the business of radon testing to have all tests analyzed by a facility listed in the EPA National Radon Profiency Program.

House Bill 1367, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 19, 1989, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 524.
