In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 730.

This bill prohibits individual or group health insurance policies from imposing a copayment, deductible, or other condition on an insured or certificate holder utilizing the services of a community pharmacy that is not imposed on an insured or certificate holder utilizing the services of a mail order pharmacy.

House Bill 338, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 25, 1989, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 730.
