11-703. REFUSING TO AID VESSEL IN DISTRESS.

AFTER RECEIVING NOTICE, A LICENSED PILOT MAY NOT REFUSE TO AID A VESSEL THAT IS IN DISTRESS:

- (1) WITHIN 18 NAUTICAL MILES SOUTH OF CAPE HENRY;
- (2) WITHIN 18 NAUTICAL MILES EAST OF CAPE HENRY; OR
- (3) IN THE CHESAPEAKE BAY.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 74, § 12, as that section related to the refusal of a licensed pilot to aid a vessel in distress under certain circumstances, and restated to prohibit the refusal.

11-704. USE OF UNAUTHORIZED PILOT BOAT.

UNLESS A PERSON IS A LICENSED PILOT, THE PERSON MAY NOT USE A BOAT AS A PILOT BOAT.

(C) USE OF UNAUTHORIZED PILOT BOAT.

A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF § 11-704 OF THIS SUBTITLE SHALL PAY A FINE OF \$150 TO THE BOARD.
