

The Business Occupations Article Review Committee notes, for consideration by the General Assembly, that, consistent with the former law, the exemption under subsection (c)(3) of this section does not include the "good faith" requirement customarily found in comparable provisions in the Code.

15-207. CERTIFICATION ABOUT LICENSEE OR PERMIT HOLDER.

(A) REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATION.

ON REQUEST OF ANY PERSON AND PAYMENT OF A FEE OF \$10, THE BOARD SHALL CERTIFY THE LICENSING OR PERMIT STATUS AND QUALIFICATIONS OF ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE REQUEST.

(B) CONTENTS OF CERTIFICATION.

EACH CERTIFICATION UNDER THIS SECTION:

(1) SHALL INCLUDE A STATEMENT OF THE LICENSING OR PERMIT STATUS OF THE PERSON WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF THE REQUEST; AND

(2) MAY INCLUDE:

(I) INFORMATION ABOUT THE EXAMINATION RESULTS AND OTHER QUALIFICATIONS OF THAT PERSON;

(II) INFORMATION ABOUT THE DATES OF ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL OF THE LICENSE OR PERMIT OF THAT PERSON;

(III) INFORMATION ABOUT ANY DISCIPLINARY ACTION TAKEN AGAINST THAT PERSON; AND

(IV) IF AUTHORIZED BY THAT PERSON, INFORMATION ABOUT ANY COMPLAINT AGAINST THAT PERSON.

(C) FEE.

THE BOARD SHALL COLLECT A FEE OF \$10 FOR EACH CERTIFICATION UNDER THIS SECTION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Subsections (a) and (b) of this section are new language added to fill a gap in the former law, which required the Board to collect a fee for certification of licensees but failed to state a duty to make a certification or minimum requirements for the certifications and failed to provide for certification of permit holders. These additions conform to similar provisions elsewhere in this article and to the practice of the Board.
