15-305. EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE, AND EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS.

(A) IN GENERAL.

IN ADDITION TO THE OTHER QUALIFICATIONS FOR A LICENSE TO PRACTICE LAND SURVEYING, AN APPLICANT SHALL QUALIFY UNDER THIS SECTION BY MEETING THE EDUCATIONAL AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (B), (C), OR (D) OF THIS SECTION.

(B) APPROVED CURRICULUM OPTION.

(1) AN APPLICANT QUALIFIES UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE APPLICANT:

(I) HAS BEEN GRADUATED FROM A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY ON COMPLETION OF AT LEAST A 4-YEAR CURRICULUM IN ENGINEERING OR LAND SURVEYING, OR THEIR EQUIVALENT, THAT THE BOARD APPROVES;

(II) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, HAS AT LEAST 4 YEARS OF WORK EXPERIENCE IN LAND SURVEYING THAT IS SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND THAT INDICATES TO THE BOARD THAT THE APPLICANT MAY BE COMPETENT TO PRACTICE LAND SURVEYING; AND

(III) HAS PASSED THE FOLLOWING EXAMINATIONS GIVEN BY THE BOARD UNDER THIS SUBTITLE:

1. A WRITTEN EXAMINATION IN THE FUNDAMENTALS OF LAND SURVEYING; AND

2. A WRITTEN EXAMINATION IN THE PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF LAND SURVEYING.
