A prisoner released from actual confinement who wilfully fails to return to the county jail at the time specified in such agreement shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be subject to the penalties provided for escape in [Article 27, § 139 of this Code] § 139 OF THIS ARTICLE. A prisoner released from actual confinement who violates any other condition of such agreement shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be subject to an additional term of imprisonment in the county jail of not more than six months.

(c) The administrator may:

(1) Establish for the rehabilitation and training of any individual sentenced to imprisonment at any Anne Arundel County detention facility, any program that enables any prisoner to:

(i) Attend any vocational or educational institution in the county;

(ii) Work at gainful private employment in the county; or

(iii) Participate in any other training or rehabilitation program in the county;
