(a) Any person or persons, or any taxpayer, or any officer, department, board, bureau of the jurisdiction, jointly or severally aggrieved by any decision of the board of appeals, or by a zoning action by the local legislative body, may appeal the same to the Circuit Court for Baltimore City. Such appeal shall be taken according to the Maryland Rules as set forth in [Chapter 1100] CHAPTER 1100, Subtitle B. Nothing in this subsection shall change the existing standards for review of any zoning action.
