[Respite Care for Developmentally Disabled Persons]

RESPITE CARE FOR DEVELOPMENTALLY AND FUNCTIONALLY DISABLED PERSONS

128.

- (a) "Respite care" means short-term care of an individual with a developmental or functional disability or an individual with a head injury who, notwithstanding age, meets the definition of developmentally disabled, which is provided either within or outside the individual's home for the purpose of giving temporary relief to the individual or to the family.
- Subject to the appropriation provided for this program in the State budget, respite care for one individual may not exceed the following limits within a State fiscal year:
- (1) Up to a total of 24 hours of care which is provided in periods of less than 10 hours in any 24-hour period; and
- (2) Up to 14 days of care a "day" being defined for purposes of this section as no fewer than 10 nor more than hours in any 24-hour period.
- The term "developmentally disabled" means a severe, chronic disability of a person which:
- (1) Is attributable to mental а or impairment or combination of mental and physical impairments, including a head injury;
 - (2) Is manifested before the person attains age 22;
 - (3) Is likely to continue indefinitely;
- (4) Results in substantial functional limitations three or more of the following areas of major life activity: (i)
