(a) An employer and any individuals or labor organizations representing a substantial number of employees involved petition the Commissioner of the Department of and Industry, in such form as prescribed by the Commissioner, permission to enter into a consent election agreement leading to a determination by the Commissioner or his durepresentative of the facts ascertained after duly authorized such election. Where a petition has been duly filed, the Commissioner shall cause notice of such petition to be posted at the place of employment for a period of time sufficient for all interested parties to be made aware of the nature and purpose of petition. The notice of each such petition caused to be posted by [Commission] COMMISSIONER shall state that any organization may file an objection or exception to the petition with Commissioner within a time period prescribed by the Commissioner, such time period to be not less than one week from the date of the posting of such notice. If no objections or exceptions to the petition are received by the Commissioner within the time period prescribed by the Commissioner, he shall grant approval to the petitioner to enter into a consent election agreement. a description of the appropriate unit, agreement shall include the time and place of holding the election, and the payroll to be used in determining which employees within the appropriate shall be eligible to vote.
