- (ii) Pursuing a supervised course of study in an accredited or approved educational program leading to a degree or certificate in:
  - 1. Occupational therapy; or
  - 2. Limited occupational therapy or its equivalent;
- (3) An occupational therapy aide who aids in the practice of occupational therapy if the aide:
- (i) Works only under the direct supervision of a licensed occupational therapist; and
- (ii) Performs only support activities that do not require advanced training in the basic anatomical, biological, psychological, and social sciences that are used in the practice of occupational therapy;
- (4) An occupational therapist [who is not a resident of this State and] who is authorized to practice occupational therapy in any other state, if the occupational therapist:
- (i) Practices occupational therapy in this State for not more than 90 days in any calendar year; and
- (ii) [Either practices] PRACTICES occupational therapy in this State only in association with a licensed occupational therapist and notifies the Board before practicing occupational therapy in this State; or
- (5) An occupational therapy assistant [who is not a resident of this State and] who is authorized to practice limited occupational therapy in any other state, if the occupational therapy assistant:
- (i) Practices limited occupational therapy in this State for not more than 90 days in any calendar year;
- (ii) Notifies the Board before practicing limited occupational therapy in this State; and
- (iii) Practices limited occupational therapy in this State only under the supervision of a licensed occupational therapist.

## 10-302.

- (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
  - (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
  - (c) The applicant shall be at least 18 years old.
- (d) An applicant for an occupational therapist license shall have completed successfully:
