- (ii) Has not practiced actively physical therapy or limited physical therapy in this State during that period;
 - (iii) Otherwise is entitled to be licensed;
 - (iv) Pays to the Board the application fee set by the Board; [and]
- (v) Submits to the Board an application on the form required by the Board; AND
- (VI) HAS MET THE CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS OF § 13-311(D) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- (2) The Board may not require the physical therapist or physical therapist assistant who qualifies for reinstatement under this subsection to be reexamined under § 13–306 of this subtitle.

A person who violates any provision of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.}

IF, AFTER A HEARING UNDER § 13–317 OF THIS TITLE, THE BOARD FINDS THAT THERE ARE GROUNDS UNDER § 13–316 OF THIS TITLE TO SUSPEND OR REVOKE A LICENSE TO PRACTICE PHYSICAL THERAPY OF OR LIMITED PHYSICAL THERAPY, TO REPRIMAND A LICENSEE, OR TO REFUSE TO LICENSE AN APPLICANT, THE BOARD MAY IMPOSE A PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000÷
