- (i) A nonprofit or governmental organization located in the State; or
- (ii) A single individual or business that provides recycling services for its own employees or for its own recyclable materials generated on its own premises.
- [(h)](J) "Recycling services" means the services provided by persons engaged in the business of recycling, including the collection, processing, storage, purchase, sale, or disposition of recyclable materials.
- [(i)] (K) "Resource recovery facility" means a facility in existence as of January 1, 1988 that:
- (1) Processes solid waste to produce valuable resources, including steam, electricity, metals, or refuse-derived fuel; and
- (2) Achieves a volume reduction of at least 50 percent of its solid waste stream.
- [(j)] (L) (1) "Solid waste stream" means garbage or refuse that would, unless recycled, be disposed of in a refuse disposal system located in this State.
  - (2) "Solid waste stream" does not include:
    - (i) Hospital waste;
    - (ii) Rubble;
    - (iii) Scrap material;
    - (iv) Land clearing debris;
    - (v) Sewage sludge; or
- (vi) Waste generated by a single individual or business and disposed of in a facility dedicated solely for that entity's waste.
  - [(k)](M) "White goods" includes:
    - (1) Refrigerators;
    - (2) Stoves;
    - (3) Washing machines;
    - (4) Dryers;
    - (5) Water heaters; and
    - (6) Air conditioners.
- [(1)] (B) "Compost" means the product of composting in accordance with the standards established by the Secretary of Agriculture under § 6-221 of the Agriculture Article.
